

Circuit around Mt. Yotei Course



Hirafu ski areas - JR Kutchan Station Course

This is an 6 mile (9-km) course to the center of Kutchan Town. Along the way, you can enjoy beautiful views of Mt. Yotei and drop by Lerch Memorial Park where there is a bronze statue of Lieutenant Colonel Lerch, who introduced skiing to Japan.



The times required are calculated at the speeds of 4.0 mile/h for walking, 6.2 mile/h for running and 9.9 mile/h for cycling.



Climate in the Niseko area

The Niseko area is blessed with rich natural surroundings, but because of this the area is easily affected by weather.

The ideal months for running or walking are May to October. There is no rainy season, and the temperature does not rise as high as in Tokyo, allowing people to enjoy sports in the fresh air. After the beautiful foliage season from September when mountains are tinged with red leaves, it begins to snow in October. The Niseko area has much snow in winter and the temperature drops rapidly. Be sure to prepare sufficiently for the cold.



With little traffic you can enjoy travelling at speed on the downward slope from Annupuri. This is a varied and pleasant course where the magnificent Mt. Yotei appears and disappears throughout the trip.



Niseko Ohashi (Bridge) The bridge with distinctive large vellow arches right beside Niseko Station is a well-known sight of Niseko. Railway tracks and the Shiribetsu River run under the bridge, from where you can see the SL (Steam Locomotive) Niseko Train in autumn.



Annupuri-Hirafu Course

A course along Mt. Niseko Annupuri. You can enjoy places of interest in Niseko. This dynamic course connects ski areas in Niseko Annupur and Grand Hirafu.

The Twin Cherry Trees

Pretty cherry trees standing side by side as if snuggling up to each other. Their sight with Mt. Yotei as a backdrop will make you feel the expansiveness of Niseko. This place is also popular as a photo spot. Please take care not to enter the fields in front of the trees

Hirafu-Hangetsuko Course

A course that starts from the Grand Hirafu ski area, turns back at Lake Hangetsu and returns through another route. The area around Lake Hangetsu is a natural park that makes for a good place to take a rest. This course is recommended for those who wish to run while seeing the looming Mt. Yotei.



Hangetsuko Reserve

The area around Lake Hangetsu a crescent-shaped volcano lake is a natural park. There is a walking trail (approx. 40 min.) that encircles the lake. People can enjoy walking though woods in summer and colored leaves in autumn. There is a campsite nearby.



St. Moritz Ohashi (Bridge)



This bridge was named Saint Moritz because Kutchan Town has a sister-city relationship with the city. The Shiribetsu River and the railway tracks run below the bridge, making it a popular photo spot for bird watchers and railroad enthusiasts.

Hirafu Kogen Chuo Park

This park is located on higher ground with glorious views of Mt. Yotei. The park, which features a waterfall and a stream, is ideal for taking a rest. Rest rooms located in the Welcome Center nearby.







Beautiful Condo / Buldings

In recent years, many modern, stylish condominiums have been built around the Grand Hirafu ski area. They create an atmosphere that is very un-Japanese.
